CONTRACTOR COMMITTEE

- Receives updates on the activities of the Electrical Safety Authority's (ESA) Contractor Advisory Council (CoAC), the Electrical Contractor Registration Agency Advisory Council (ECRA), and the Master Examining Committee (MEC).
- Provides small contractor collective input into the above organizations on emerging issues and opportunities.

The Committee meets nine times a year and functions as the very important hub of advocacy and two-way information sharing within OEL. Members of this Committee are able to identify and act on proposed regulations and rule changes.

ECRA's achievements over 2023/24 include:

- Providing updates on our activities at ESA Board of Directors' meetings.
- Advising on activities and initiatives to be included in ESA's license strategy, compliance and enforcement efforts.
- Offering input on license awareness campaigns for electrical contractors.
- Assisting in closing out the remaining recommendations stemming from the 2020 Auditor's General Report.
- Working in partnership with MEC to address issues surrounding the virtual exam, particularly concerning fraud. Investigations are ongoing.
- Exploring opportunities to enhance competency among MEs. A working group on continuing education has been postponed to 2025.

ECRA remains committed to fostering and supporting a culture of safety among contractors, with a focus on lowering incidences of defects.

ECRA is also involved in:

- Collaborating with stakeholders to provide input and advice on Administrative Monetary Penalties (AMPS).
- Developing required frameworks.
- Inputting into fee brackets.
- Reviewing and recommending offense category details.



ECRA members gather feedback and offer guidance on pilot initiatives within the regulatory compliance program. Furthermore, our Members actively participate in the creation, validation and testing of the compensation profile for Master Electricians.

All in all, ECRA membership fosters valuable conversations about our sector, particularly enriched by its diverse viewpoints. This contributes to the collective strength and effectiveness of our impact. I am privileged to be part of the ECRA team.

MASTER EXAMINING COMMITTEE (MEC)

The Master Examining Committee (MEC) oversees content of the Master Electrician (ME) exam and the examination process. Reporting to ECRA, this Committee is made up of representatives from the OEL, ECAO and ESA, and meets four times a year. Collaborating with the ESA Director of Licensing and other ESA staff, the MEC ensures the efficient and effective operation of the Master Electrician accreditation process.



In 2023/24, the MEC held four meetings. The ME exam is available in three options, in-person written, in-person electronic, and virtual. Monitoring all three sections closely, we've observed consistency in the exam results final pass rate and score. As of late 2023, the virtual exam has been temporarily suspended pending review.

Our goal is to maintain fairness and relevance in exam questions. We regularly review content and introduce new questions as needed. Recommendations on ME exam policies are regularly presented to ECRA.

To assist exam candidates, we've updated the website with comprehensive preparation information. The ME exam will soon also align with the new Competency Profile and the next version of the Ontario Electrical Safety Code.

It was another productive year with the Council of Advisory Committees (CoAC). They eagerly shared upcoming plans and demonstrated receptiveness to our concerns. Here are some key points:

- Hiring new inspectors to target the underground economy, such as car chargers and dumpsters in driveways for renovations. They are actively seeking input from contractors to focus their efforts effectively.
- Lobbying against the removal of the 48-hour grace period as recommended by the new CSA code. Every contractor expressed opposition to this proposal during the meeting, leading to a constructive dialogue. This is currently being reviewed.
- Plans are underway to expand the ESA phone app's functionality to include scheduling
 inspections, accessing additional notification information, and accessing financial commitments &
 outstanding balances.
- Monthly "Toolbox Talks" are available on ESA's website, providing valuable update information for OEL contractors and their staff.

Finally, I would like to congratulate Matt Scratch on being confirmed as CoAC's new Co-Chair, joining Dave Ackison.




